NOVICE Pass auf! Study List for 2026

This is the first version of what I intend to be an annual publication to let students entered in Novice *Pass auf!* know exactly which material to study this year. The information covered in *Pass auf!* is vast and overwhelming; this list will allow Novice contestants to focus on things that will <u>actually be asked</u> in the matches they will play.

I stress that this document applies <u>only to the **Novice** level</u>, not the Varsity level. Varsity contestants should refer to the complete study guide published in September 2025. I also stress that this document applies <u>only to the **2026** Novice contest</u>. As I write this, I have just finished putting together the question sets that will be used at the 2026 regional Novice tournaments (except for the topic Current Events & Special Topic), and this list reflects the exact material that is covered, plus a light sprinkling of decoys. I will publish new and completely different lists in 2027 and every year after that, reflecting exactly what is covered in the question sets for those years.

It should be pretty obvious that the questions below are not the actual questions in the games. Rather, they are meant to guide you as to which information to look up on each topic.

Arts & Letters

- Who were the "big 2" of German baroque music?
- What are some of **Beethoven**'s most famous compositions, including his symphonies and their nicknames?
- What are the most famous operas composed by Mozart?
- Which cities were important in Goethe's life?
- What are some of Friedrich Schiller's most famous works?
- What are Friedrich Nietzsche's main ideas and works?
- What was important about these people: Sigmund Freud, Johannes Gutenberg, Heinrich Hertz, Robert Koch, Carl Orff, Sylvia Plath, Charles M. Schulz, Johann Strauss Sr., Kurt Vonnegut?
- What did these actors/directors accomplish: Fritz Lang, Luise Rainer, Arnold Schwarzenegger (including his political career), Christoph Waltz?
- Fairy tales: What is the plot of "Die Bremer Stadtmusikanten"? What are the German titles of "Cinderella" and "Snow White"?
- In which 3 cities was the Bauhaus located?
- What is the *Jugendstil* style of architecture?

Current Events & Special Topic

• You're on your own for this category. Keep up with the news and research this year's special topic, Expressionism in the arts of the German-speaking world.

Erdkunde (asked and answered in German)

- Don't forget the vocabulary list of geography terms on p. 2 of the main study guide.
- Know the **capitals** of the 4 German-speaking countries (D-A-CH-FL) and of the *Bundesländer* of D-A (excluding the city-states Berlin, Bremen, Hamburg, and Vienna)! I won't reveal which ones will be asked this year.
- Which countries border D?
- What are the 2 most populous Bundesländer of D-A and cantons of CH?
- What are the 4 Großlandschaften of D?
- What and where is the **Elbphilharmonie**?
- What and where is the Striezelmarkt?
- What are the **main rivers** of Bremen, Dresden, and München?
- Which cantons have the north-/south-/east-/westernmost points of D-CH?
- What is the **capital of Südtirol**, the German-speaking province of Italy?
- What is the **largest island** of D?
- What is the **highest mountain of the Harz** mountain range?

- Where is the headquarters of Lufthansa?
- Where is the largest stadium in D?
- What are the main cities of Hessen, Niedersachsen, and Rheinland-Pfalz?
- What are the main sights of Berlin, Bremerhaven, Dresden, and Vienna?
- Which Bundesland surrounds Berlin? Vienna?
- What are some cities of D that start with the unusual letters J, Q, and X?
- In which *Bundesland* is the **geographic center of D**?
- In which cities were **Beethoven and Brecht born**?

History & Politics

- Who are the current heads of state and government of D-A-CH-FL?
- What are the populations of D-A-CH to the nearest million?
- What are the 2 houses of the **German parliament**, and what is the maximum number of years between national elections?
- Liechtenstein: Which currency does FL use, who was the first prince to live there full-time?
- What is the AfD?
- What is the German title of the leader of a German Bundesland (like a governor in the US)?
- What is the official residence of the president of D?
- What is the European Union, and are D-A-CH-FL in it?
- What was the Thirty Years' War?
- Who was August the Strong?
- Who were the 3 emperors of D 1871-1918, and which dynastic family did they belong to?
- Who was Prince Regent **Luitpold** of Bavaria?
- What was the **Zimmermann Telegram**?
- Who was Karl Renner?
- What were the start and end dates of World War II (in Europe)?
- German-American history: What is important about Baron von Steuben? the Brooklyn Bridge?
- **German-Texan history**: What is important about **Indianola**/Carlshafen? Who were the **first 2 commissioners** of the **Adelsverein**?
- What is the status of **nuclear power generation in D**?
- What is the historical significance of Aachen Cathedral?
